TECHNICAL/COMMUNITY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Owatonna Foundation is pleased to make available \$15,000 to be used to assist students who will be attending **non-four year programs at technical/community colleges to prepare themselves for technical careers**. To be eligible, you must graduate with the 2021 high school graduating class. Scholarship awards will range from \$500 to \$3,000 each.

Applications must be submitted no later than April 10, 2021. Please return all information to your school counselor or career center; or to Jill Holmes, Owatonna Foundation Scholarship Coordinator, 1135 Jadden Lane SE, Owatonna, MN 55060.

An anonymous committee will select scholarship recipients. Applicant information will be shared with the Foundation's scholarship committee. The announcement of winners will be made at high school award ceremonies.

INFORMATION REQUESTED:

- Completed application.
- Response to essay question.
- High school transcript, including individual class grades and class rank.
- High school attendance records.
- Official college transcript, if you are enrolled in the post-secondary enrollment option (PSEO) or at a college.
- A letter from one person (preferably a current or former employer or school personnel and not a family member) who will attest to your personal qualifications and indicate why you deserve this scholarship.

CRITERIA FOR GRANTING SCHOLARSHIPS:

- Applicant must be graduating with this year's graduating class from Owatonna High School, Owatonna Alternative Learning Center, Eagle Academy, Owatonna Christian School, Choice Technical Academy, or Pillsbury College Prep.
- Parent or guardian of applicant must be a resident of Steele County.
- Applicant must indicate and display a strong aptitude and desire to train for a <u>technical career</u> beyond the high school level.
- Applicant must maintain a C+ average or better during his/her junior and senior years.
- Applicant must have attended at least 90 percent of the required days during his/her senior year of high school.
- Applicant should possess and display good study habits.
- Applicant should display a positive attitude and be a good role model.
- Applicant should exhibit an interest in school, community, and/or work-related activities.
